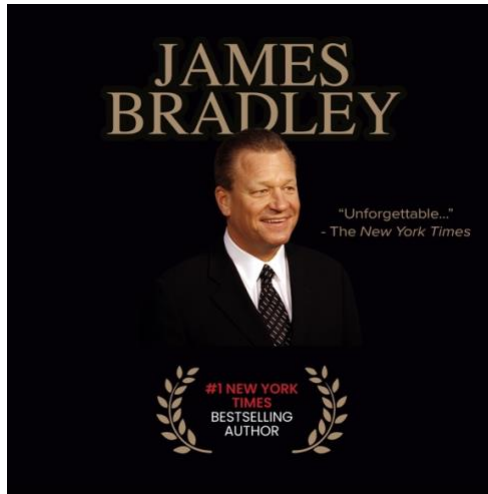

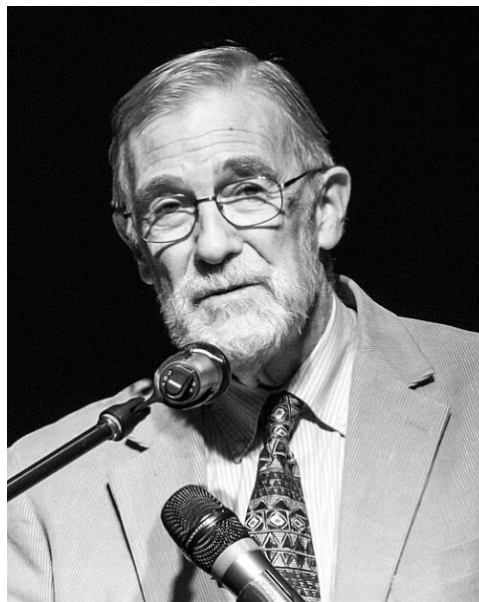

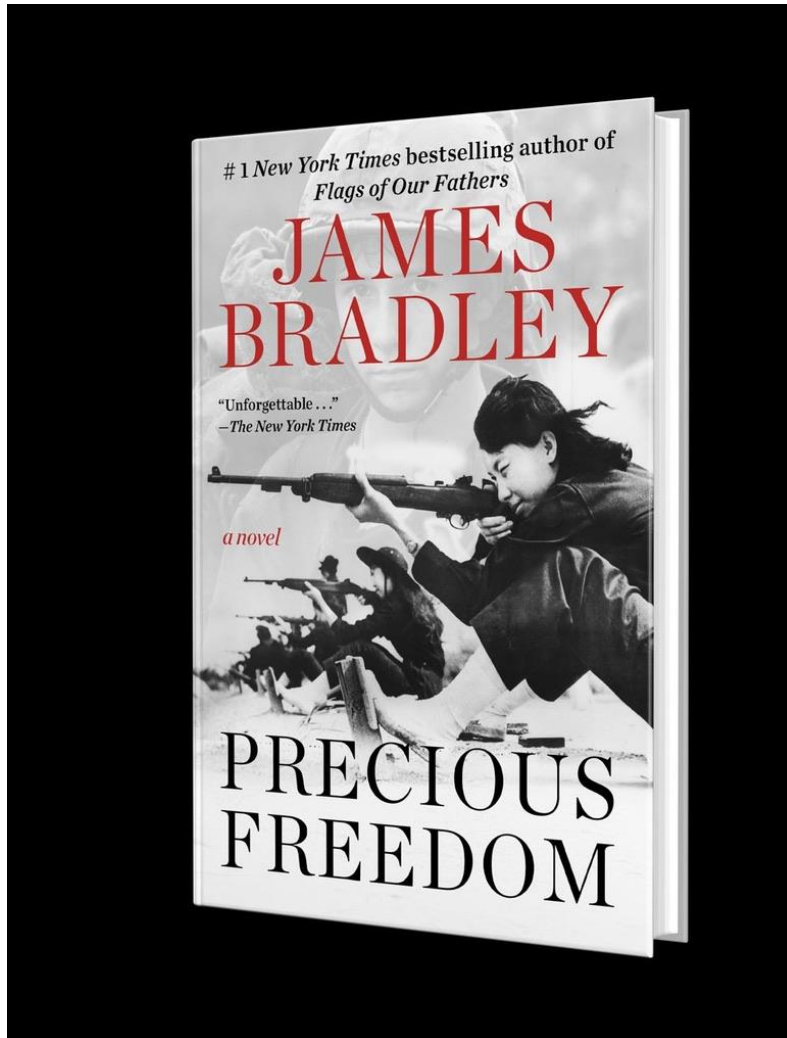

For a third opinion on *JFK and the Unspeakable*, you could ask my friend--the great Ray McGovern. Ray was a CIA analyst from 1963 to 1990, and in the 1980s chaired National Intelligence Estimates. Ray was the CIA briefer for President Ronald Reagan and President George Herbert Walker Bush. Ray received the Intelligence Commendation Medal at his retirement. Ray returned it in 2006 to protest the CIA's involvement in torture.



James Bradley journeyed to Iwo Jima and returned with *Flags of Our Fathers* and now ventures to Vietnam and brings us *Precious Freedom* where he reveals that, if we'd known what happened in the 1960s in Vietnam, American mothers would never have sent their children to Iraq and Afghanistan.
